THE PROJECT

ince 1984, the **Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Program** has worked with some of the state's finest master folk artists to keep Missouri's artistic heritage alive and well. The **Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Program** funds teams of master artists and apprentices who are committed to sustaining their artistic traditions and cultural heritage. Priority is given to teams who share the same cultural community. Priority may also be given to living art forms with few remaining practitioners. **The Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Program** also seeks new applicants each year to better represent the spectrum of cultural communities across the state.

Missouri's **Traditional Apprenticeship Program** (TAAP), funded by the National Endowment for the Arts since inception, is coordinated by the Missouri Folk Arts Program with support from the Missouri Arts Council, a division of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, and the Museum of Art and Archaeology at the University of Missouri.









KEY DEFINITIONS AND APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Please read carefully before filling out the application.

I. KEY DEFINITIONS

Traditional arts: Also called folk arts, traditional arts are learned and passed on to the next generation informally by word of mouth, imitation and observation within cultural communities (family, ethnic, regional, religious, or occupational groups) rather than in formal academic settings. Traditional arts encompass many forms including crafts, music, dance, verbal arts and foodways.

Cultural community: A group sharing cultural, regional, ethnic, racial, religious, gender, age, and/or occupational bonds. Such groups share customs, heritage, and artistic expressions, which include the traditional arts.

Master artists: A traditional artist who is regarded by his or her cultural community and peers as a highly skilled and knowledgeable practitioner of that groups' traditional arts.

Apprentice: An apprentice possesses intermediate experience in the tradition (or a related art form), a strong desire to advance knowledge and skills in the art form, and commitment to its continuity.

II. APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

 The master artist and apprentice must complete the attached application form. SECTION B is for the master artist, SECTION C is for the apprentice, and SECTION D is for both master artist and apprentice. Design the work plan to occur between between November 1, 2024 and May 15, 2025.

NOTE: Only one application per master artist will be accepted. The master artist may teach more than one apprentice.

2. Both master artist and apprentice must submit work samples with their three-part application, or the application is incomplete. Panelists will review all materials online.

Contact the Folk Arts Specialist to coordinate delivery via online storage, email, or postal service.

Please note the requirements for work samples.

- Visual Art/Crafts teams should provide FIVE digital images each (JPEG format) with brief descriptions. Artists may submit prints on photo paper by mail.
- Music/Storytelling teams should provide up to FIVE minutes each of audio recording (in common formats like mp3, way, or mpeg4). Links to video from YouTube or Vimeo are acceptable. Team should provide recording descriptions and time cues with application.
- Dance teams should provide up to FIVE minutes of video recordings each (in common formats like mp4, mov, or mpeg4). Links to video from YouTube or Vimeo are acceptable. Team should provide recording descriptions and time cues with application.

III. APPLICATION ASSISTANCE

Applicants should contact Folk Arts Specialist Deb Bailey to discuss their proposals, work samples, and questions. Bailey is available through **August 19, 2024** to advise teams as they draft applications, and then to help coordinate delivery of materials through the **September 3, 2024** deadline.

IV. ELIGIBILITY AND REVIEW CRITERIA

- The art to be learned must be a traditional art as defined in this application.
- The apprentice must be a resident of Missouri.
- The master artist must demonstrate artistic excellence, cultural knowledge and teaching ability.
- The apprentice must demonstrate intermediate experience and commitment.
- The budget and study plan must be appropriate to the project and the traditional art form.
- Priority is given to master artists and apprentices who share cultural communities.
- Priority is given to living traditional art forms with few practitioners left in the local community.

NOTE: Panelists also apply a criteria called "program needs" to ensure that a spectrum of traditional art forms, cultural communities, as well as new and repeat master artists are represented in the final selection of applicants.

V. REVIEW PANEL AND NOTIFICATION

A rotating independent panel of traditional arts specialists convenes to review applications and choose apprenticeship teams. A letter or email informing the master artists of the panel's decision will be delivered in **late October 2024.**
